



Strengthening Families

The Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework is a research-based approach that emphasizes techniques to support families in building their capacity for healthy caregiving and stronger childhood outcomes. There are five Protective Factors: Parental Resilience, Social Connections, Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development, Children's Social and Emotional Competence, and Concrete Supports in Times of Need. The Strengthening Families training helps teachers by giving them tools to create a more supportive and nurturing environment that fosters resilience, strengthens family connections, and promotes children's well-being.

Participants will learn:

- to gain insights into the challenges families face, which can help them empathize with students and provide appropriate support. They learn strategies to better engage with families and support them, especially in stressful situations.
- techniques for building strong relationships with both students and their families, improving the classroom atmosphere and making parents feel welcomed and involved in their child's education.
- how to build resilience not only in children but also in themselves by practicing self-care and managing stress effectively. The training emphasizes the importance of teachers' own well-being as they support students and families.
- practical strategies to help children develop emotional regulation, problem-solving, and relationship skills, which are crucial for both academic and personal success.

The Program for Infant/Toddler Care's (PITC)
Six Essential Program Practices for RelationshipBased Care

Overview

The six essential program practices of the Program for Infant/Toddler Care (PITC) promote responsive, caring relationships between caregivers and the infants and toddlers they serve. Research suggests that high-quality early care and education programs for infants and toddlers that use a relationship-based care framework support optimal development and learning. Relationship-based program practices include: Primary Care, Small Groups, Continuity of Care, Individualized Care, Culturally Sensitive Care, and Inclusion of Children with Special Needs. The goal of this training is to support Infant Toddler Professionals in their developmental understanding and implementation of relationship-based program practice to support high quality infant/toddler care in both centers based and family child care settings. including Early Head Start. This series helps promote essential program practices to ensure quality within family child care and center-based programs that serve infants and toddlers.

- the Program for Infant /Toddler Care (PITC) six essential program practices and consider training implications for relationship-based care.
